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Church Leadership Team, meeting earlier this week, have decided that we should look to re-open our Church, for public worship on the day of Pentecost, the Churches' birthday, May 23rd. We hope the Junior Church will be able to recommence on the same day. As we have become familiar with over the past year this is subject to change if there is a further significant spike in cases.

Currently we are not aware of what conditions will apply on May 23rd but we will have to operate within Government and Church guidelines in place at the time. This means I cannot give you an accurate picture of what it will be like. Our planning will necessarily be based on the current position but will change if the advice to Churches is eased.

In simple terms we have to assume that people will need to book a place and provide contact details to help with track and trace. So can I again offer you the following possibilities:

1 To book a regular seat each week and just inform me when you will not be attending

2 To book a seat by the preceding Wednesday of the weeks you wish to attend

If you try to book after the Wednesday there may not be a space. If there are more applicants than seats a draw will be made to allocate places. I should also say that if there is more demand for seats than places available we will look to holding a second service. So please do not hold back from booking a place as we really would like to try and accommodate as many as possible. Under the current guidelines only a small choir or soloist can sing, we will have to leave windows and doors open to aid ventilation and face masks will be mandatory unless people have a medical exemption. Under the current rules the congregation will need to leave as soon as the service concludes. I know this is not how we would want the situation to be but we have to act responsibly. Without wishing to raise expectations there is some suggestions that the position may change after May 17th.

I should also point out that under the current guidance lifts can be offered provided those in the car wear face masks unless exempt

Please do ask any questions you may have and please pray for our community as we, hopefully, move towards something more normal.

Then a couple of other things:

Hopefully this would not be too onerous as there is one major tenant operating Monday to Friday. If you feel this is a way you could serve the Church it would be good to have a conversation.

We will try to keep everyone aware of any necessary changes to our plans.
