### Latest news

From 1<sup>st</sup> May 2020 our part-time staff have taken a reduced salary to reflect the reduction in some aspects of their work during this time. Matthew Barber, the Police & Crime Commissioner for Thames Valley visited us and met with our Lead Chaplain, Mark (pictured right) and Ken (one of our town centre Chaplains), to find out about our work; his office have previously awarded us grants towards running costs and he expressed appreciation of our work in Aylesbury.

We have been awarded a grant of £2000 from the Rothschild Foundation towards our work.
