The WDP services for 2022 will be held on Friday 4th March.

This year, the service has been prepared by England, Wales, and Northern Ireland. The theme this year is the Bible text "I

know the plans I have for you" from Jeremiah, to reflect on some of the issues facing us today: poverty, domestic abuse, and disability, finding hope in difficult situations and encouragement in the help we can give to each other. The overarching theme of the service is HOPE – very appropriate for this time when the world is coming to terms with the ongoing risks of a pandemic and the looming climate crisis.

Last year, because of the pandemic, we were unable to hold any services in person, but we hope this year will continue as planned with the afternoon service at 1.30pm at the Church of the Holy Spirit, Bedgrove, and the evening service at 7.30pm held at Aylesbury Methodist Church.

I am part of a very small WDP committee, and we have all agreed to approach our respective church congregations to see if anyone would like to take part in any way as follows, in either/both of the services:

- Reading a small part in the service (no lines to learn, it is read straight from the booklet; I already have a supply of these if you would like to see what is involved)
- Providing/helping with refreshments (cake and beverages) after the service
- Meet and greet before service starts

If you have not been to a WDP service before and would like to know more about it before committing yourself, please do not hesitate to get in touch with me. We will be holding a 'read through' of the service on Friday 25th February at each church, at the same time as the WDP services will be held, so people will be more familiar on the day with the order of service. *Please let me know if you would like to be involved in any way at all.* All are welcome.

CIRCUIT LEADERSHIP TEAM

This Sunday, 16 January, the Circuit Leadership Team is the focus of our Circuit Prayers. The CLT plays a vital role in ensuring that our Circuit functions well and that every part and every member of our Circuit is cared for and enabled to perform at its very best in serving our Lord. Please remember this hard-working, devoted set of people in your prayers this Sunday.

The Circuit Leadership Team (CLT) has had a very busy 2021 seeking a permanent replacement for Donna and, after two rounds of the stationing process, we, in the guise of the Circuit Invitation Committee, are still actively involved in the business of finding that new minister. We hope to be successful in round three!

We are fortunate in finding a supernumerary minister, John Amankwatia as an interim replacement until August. John, from Ghana, is installed with his family in the Stewkley manse and is already making his mark in the Circuit. We are truly blessed in having such a capable and popular minister available even if it has to be on a temporary basis.

The CLT, which comprises ministers, circuit stewards, circuit treasurer, circuit meeting secretary and lay workers, meet every couple of months. Each member of the CLT is automatically a member of the circuit meeting, which meets two or three times a year.

The CLT, in its role as the circuit invitation committee, is involved in the appointment of new ministers, as well as the consultation process for reinvitation of existing ministers.

The CLT is responsible, with the superintendent and the other ministers in the circuit, for the spiritual and material well-being of the circuit and for upholding and acting upon the decisions of the circuit meeting. In discharging these responsibilities, the CLT is sensitive to the needs of

ministers and their families, staying in contact with them and keeping themselves informed of the activities and needs of each church for which the minister has pastoral responsibility.

In additional to its pastoral and practical role in the circuit, the CLT needs to keep abreast of church policies at district and connexional levels, which impact upon the lives of our churches.

We are fortunate in having a broad range of skill sets and experience across the team, and we have in the last year added two new members: Cathy Whiteway and Kathryn Trout, both of whom are actively engaged in circuit duties and whose skills are noted and appreciated both within the team and in the circuit.

We are constantly on the lookout for new members to enhance the team, with a particular need for people with property expertise and experience, as the yearly demands of keeping churches and manses well maintained and in good repair can be quite demanding!

Please keep the CLT in your thoughts and prayers as we look forward to a new year with great anticipation and exciting challenges.
