Dear All,

This Sunday, 13 July, it is the turn of Wingrave to be the focus of our Circuit Prayers. We join Gay who shares her spiritual and physical journeys with us,



both in Zimbabwe and the UK. I love the way that Gay describes herself as a 'Christian', not 'Belonging' to any one denomination. How right this is, because we are all first and foremost 'Christians'; and we are not tied to any particular branch of Christianity, we are tied to Christ! Please pray for the lovely fellowship at Wingrave this Sunday, and also for all those who are 'between churches', and none, that they may find God, stand in awe of His creation, and rejoice in His love as Gay does. Pete.

My mother was an Anglican Christian and my father a professed atheist, so my family was not particularly church orientated. I remember going to Sunday school and singing joyful songs and collecting Christian stamps. However, until I was 12, religion did not feature much in my life. My mother then decided I should be confirmed and sent me to confirmation lessons - through which I mostly slept.

I was taken to church services until I was confirmed and then the family lapsed again.

However, I always believed in the existence of God. I was fortunate to grow up in Zimbabwe where I spent much of my time in the bush. I can remember always observing nature around me and being in awe of the wonder of living things. It is not hard to believe in the existence of God when you observe and understand the wonder of His creation. I studied the sciences at school and university, and my understanding of the intricacies of the processes that sustain life only increased my belief in God.

I did not invite Jesus Christ into my life until, in my 50s, an incident occurred when I was in abject despair and distress. I was praying to God for forgiveness and mercy when a deep and invading peace settled on me. I believe God, in his silence, 'spoke' to me.

This led me to attend an Alpha Course, which presented me with the evidence that Jesus was the son of God, and the truth and the way, and I invited Him into my life.

Since then, my Christian journey has moved forward and my relationship with Jesus Christ has grown steadily. I was fortunate to join a wonderful Bible study group in Zimbabwe. We became very strong together and could trust each other to share anything, good or bad. A study that we did of the 'Celebration of Discipline' particularly helped further my Christian journey.

I don't label myself as belonging to any one denomination but prefer to just call myself a Christian. I particularly enjoy attending the Methodist services in Wingrave, and the friendship of the Methodists there. I am grateful to have attended the Lent and Advent courses that they hold as they have helped my spiritual growth enormously. I appreciate and admire the Methodist outreach and the work they do for the community and for charity. Gay.
