When we start our Christian journey, none of us knows where it will take us or more importantly where we will be guided.

Next month, Len who has worshipped with us for the past few years, will become one of our members, welcomed officially into our fellowship by our minister, Noreen. During these past years, he has become, like every person in our congregation, an essential part of our family fellowship, offering to serve and help us at every opportunity.

Len's faith journey has taken him quite a bit further to places that many of us can ever dream of going. Growing up in South Africa with a mum who was a Methodist and a father a deacon in the Dutch Reformed church, Len became an elder in the church and assisted in building a new church there.
