### **AMC'S NEW CARD READER**

AMC have purchased a card reader (quaintly called a Digital Collection Plate (DCP)) to enable payments to be made to the Church's bank account by a debit or credit card.



A generous donation has been received towards the initial cost.

The DCP can be used at services, as well as other activities of the Church, such as coffee sales, lunches and other events.

It has been programmed to identify 6 different scenarios or 'funds' as follows.

- 1. General Fund (Sunday services)
- 2. Office (Letting fees, etc)
- 3. Coffee sales (Coffee bar and after-service coffees)
- 4. Repair Cafe
- 5. Badminton Club
- 6. Events (Concerts, monthly lunches, funerals etc)

Once the DCP has been set to the appropriate fund, the user can either select one of 6 preset amounts (£2, £3, £4, £5, £10 or £20) or type in the desired amount. Then the user can swipe their card.

Where the DCP is used on Sundays, it will be for the use of visitors or new members. Regular members of the congregation usually make their contribution by either a regular bank standing order or the envelope system.

The DCP will be kept in the Office where it can be kept charged.

I will receive a monthly summary of the payments, grouped by fund and with a date and amount. In this way I will be able to identify the source of the payment and record it accordingly.

I envisage the introduction of the DCP will be a gradual one and determined by each organisation. Also, I am sure that where it is used, there will be a mixture of cash and card payments for the foreseeable future.
